# Looking Back at 2020

### Success of Regional Meetings

Local meetings for networking and collaborating within the <u>current six CJSCN regions</u> began last year, and luckily such meetings were able to continue even during the pandemic, both as online and socially-distanced in-person events. CJSCN is grateful to the local sister city organization leaders who volunteered their time to set up and run these important meetings. We hope they will continue to be held in 2021 as well.

U.S.-Japan Sister Cities Bell Ringing: 75 Years of Peace Since Hiroshima & Nagasaki

In August 2020, CJSCN partnered with Sister Cities International, Inc., to promote a <u>global initiative to ring bells</u> in remembrance of the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the atomic bombing of Hiroshima and Nagasaki. In California, 24 cities with sister cities in Japan participated in the initiative, holding a variety of socially-distanced and online events.



#### 2020 Virtual Fall Workshop

In light of the ongoing pandemic, CJSCN hosted its third annual Fall Workshop on November 13, 2020 in a virtual online format. While it was unfortunate to not be able to meet in person this year, the new format provided new opportunities, such as being able to easily welcome attendees from across the entire state of California, and even from Japan. We had approximately 170 attendees join the event, representing 54 cities in California and 5 cities in Japan, plus 13 JET alumni. The workshop provided a variety of presentations and resources on current sister city activities, and how to keep programs running strong during pandemic conditions. We are extremely grateful to the Consulate Generals of Japan in <u>San Francisco</u> and <u>Los Angeles</u> for assisting us in running the technical and logistical pieces of this event. Also, we would like to thank <u>NTA</u>, <u>Pegasus Tech Ventures</u>, and <u>Takara Sake USA</u> for donating the door prizes. We also hope to establish regions in Southern California that will allow sister city organizations to begin networking and collaborating locally in Southern California, just as has been done in Northern California.

#### Plans for CJSCN Events in 2021

For the past few years, CJSCN has worked with its partners and local sister city organizations to offer a formal Fall Workshop and an informal Spring Workshop each year. Given the success of these events and our new abilities to collaborate more with groups in Southern California, CJSCN is planning to expand our event offerings in 2021. In the spring, we will host an online, all-state workshop with support from the Consulate Generals of Japan in San Francisco and Los Angeles. In the fall (conditions permitting), we will hold one in-person event in Northern California and one in-person event in Southern California (content will be the same).
